### Why do I need training?

Used correctly, ATV's, or quad bikes, are very versatile vehicles with a wide variety of uses. A range of attachments, including trailers, sprayers and spreaders, make them even more flexible and effective business tools.

The most experienced ATV riders can also find themselves in hazardous and potentially dangerous situations. Serious accidents can and do occur without proper training.

Training is a legal requirement. The Provision and Use of Work Equipment Regulations 1998 (PUWER) require employers to provide adequate training and to ensure ATVs are used only by employees who have received appropriate training in their safe use, including towed equipment and attachments. If you are self-employed, the Regulations still apply.

## Technical Awards All Terrain Vehicles (ATV's)

### ITA Sit-Astride ATV's

*There are a series of courses covering the safe use of Sit-Astride ATV's or Quads. These range from basic handling on level ground to more extensive use carrying loads and the use of trailed equipment.*

*All the courses are modular, and certification is offered on the section completed on each course.*

*Course Content:*

The four basic sections are:

- Machine knowledge
- Pre-start checks
- Safe procedures and observations
- Safe operations – level ground

Additional operational sections are as follows:

- Rough terrain
- Carrying loads
- Trailed equipment

**Full certification** requires all modules to be completed

There are three courses available depending on the competency of the driver and the number of candidates. These are:

- Two days (for candidates with little experience. Maximum number of candidates 6)
- One day (a certificate of basic training or signed experience operator declaration form is required. Maximum number of candidates 4)
- One day (the same format as the two day course but with only 2 candidates)

### ITA Sit-In ATV's

The modules covered are similar to the Sit-Astride ATV's as listed (previously) but will include any specific references to the drive system, steering/braking methods, and related stability problems.

There are three courses available depending on the competency of the driver, the number of candidates and the type of ATV (Skid or Conventional steered). These are:

#### **Skid Steered (Tracked or Multi-wheeled)**

Two days (for candidates with little experience. Maximum number of candidates 4).

One day (experienced drivers who require their skills up-dating, with certification. Maximum number of candidates 3).

#### **Conventional Steered**

One day (novice drivers would generally benefit if there are 2 machines available. Maximum No of candidates 3).
